SWIM CENTER SUMMARY


The Santa Clara International Swim Center is recognized as one of the finest outdoor aquatic facilities in the world. This fact has been attested by the leading officials, coaches and participants who have visited here. This facility compliments two Cityowned neighborhood swim centers and four school pools which are available to the public for swimming enjoyment. Local swimming interest dates back to 1951 when the War Memorial Pool was developed by the Santa Clara School District.

The decision to build the International Swim Center was made in 1965 with construction beginning in 1966 and opened to the public July 1, 1967. The swim complex includes special design features which enables a wide variety of aquatic activities to take place. During the first summer of operation, over 700 enjoyed recreational swimming each day. In early July, the first International Swimming and Diving Meet was held with 300 competitors setting nine world records and performing for over 10,000 spectators. The local synchronized swimmers and the water polo interests are daily users of the Center.

The architectural firm of L. F. Richards was retained by the City to design this out-

standing facility. Mr. Richards called on the leading aquatic consultants and pool architects and engineers to produce the final development plans. The total cost of the pools and dressing facilities including architect fees was \$653,090. Additional contributions by local individuals and organizations and work performed by City forces bring the total development cost to \$725,000, which does not include land or parking.

The International Swim Center will undoubtedly be the setting for many national and international aquatic events in the future. Already scheduled for the summer of 1968 is the National Senior Outdoor Championships for Synchronized Swimming. The Second Santa Clara International Invitational Swimming Meet is in the planning stage and efforts are being made to host significant Water Polo events. While an emphasis has been placed on competitive and aquatic spectator events, the local recreational swimming is anticipated to reach 1,000 per day in summers to come. The International Swim Center is truly a fine addition to the growing list of public facilities being developed by the City of Santa Clara.




